Pastor's Pen

The year was 155 AD and the place was Smyrna, in the Roman province of Asia. There was a new wave of persecution that was sweeping against the Christian church, and the proconsul of Smyrna was especially vicious in his pursuit and persecution of the followers of Jesus. He focused on the bishop of Smyrna, a man named Polycarp, who was almost 100 years old. When the Christians of Smyrna found out that an arrest warrant had been issued for Polycarp, they whisked him away and hid him in a barn on a farm outside of Smyrna. But the police found him and brought him into the city, to the center of an arena where there were tens of thousands of people screaming for his execution. As the old man stood in the middle of the arena, anticipating that soon he would die, the proconsul had a moment of sympathy for the old man. He raised up his arm and he silenced the crowd. When everything was quiet, the proconsul shouted out, "Polycarp! Curse the Christ and live!"

Polycarp, with a strong voice, answered back, "Eighty and six years have I served my master and king, and he has done me no wrong. I dare not blaspheme him now." With that refusal to renounce his faith in Jesus Christ, the proconsul brought down his arm, and Polycarp was executed as a Christian martyr.

I have often wondered, How did he do that? How did he remain so trusting? Where did he muster the faith and the strength to be faithful to Jesus Christ, under the worst of circumstances? I have a theory: I think Polycarp acted in line with what his mentor had taught him—and his mentor was none other than the apostle John!

The apostle John had had a most unusual relationship with Jesus. For a while, there were thousands who thronged around Jesus and hundreds who were counted as his broader network of disciples and a dozen who were his closest followers and three who were in his inner circle. But there was one who was described as "the disciple whom Jesus loved," and that was John.

John trusted Jesus. John and Jesus had a most extraordinary relationship. It was extraordinary, I think, in that John trusted Jesus in so many ways. John trusted Jesus enough to forsake prosperity. If you connect the dots on the biography of John, you discover in Mark 1:20 that he lived in the home of Zebedee, where they had servants. This was a time when most everyone was poor, and yet he was in a family that owned their own fishing business and had household servants to take care of daily chores. When you read on in the New Testament, in John 18 and 19, you find they not only had a business and a house up north on Galilee Lake, but they also had a city residence in the city of Jerusalem. They have two houses at a time when there was virtually no middle class! And in John 18, you discover this man had access to the court and Caiaphas, the high priest. So he was connected to the most important people in society. Yet one day he heard a call from this itinerant rabbi from Nazareth, who said, "Come and follow me." And he walked away from houses and business and servants and wealth in order to follow Jesus .


Now... here is the question. Do you trust Jesus? Enough to follow Him even when times are rough? Enough to follow Him when there is a bad diagnosis? Enough to follow Him when you can't understand why your child has forsaken what you have taught them and they are prodigal, forsaken the Church, and pursuing a destructive lifestyle?

And here is another question. Can Jesus trust you? Can He trust you when times are rough to continue being His follower? Can He trust you when you've received a bad diagnosis to continue to trust Him and follow Him? Can He trust you when your child goes astray to trust Him and follow Him?

Here is my prayer for you... that you can say "YES" and trust Him in all things! That you can say, "YES"... Jesus can trust me!!

New Leaf: Don't forget who you are! Don't forget your purpose! We LOVE THE LORD, LOVE ONE ANOTHER, AND MAKE DISCI-PLES FOR JESUS CHRIST! I pray that as we trust Jesus, He can trust us to do this! AMEN!

A MESSAGE FROM THE YARNS OF LOVE GROUP Hi there New Leaf family...

Yarns of Love have been busy, busy! For those of you not familiar with our group, we are a group that meet on the first and third Saturdays of the month to knit or crochet prayer shawls, lap robes, hats, scarves, Guide Post T-sweaters and baby blankets for the Erie NICU. Everything we make is blessed & prayed over on our special fifth Sunday services. The prayer shawls & lap robes are given to individuals in the hospitals & nursing homes or anyone that is going through a difficult time in their lives. The people that have received these special gifts have said they can feel the love & healing power of God as they wear them. The hat & scarves have gone to children at the center & in the community or I have also sent them to Tennessee & West Virginia to what is called The Christmas Train where they take a train load of winter items into the hill country. The baby blankets are taken by a New Leaf member to the Erie NICU to be used to cover the infant's incubator to block some of the harsh light. The families wrap the infant in it when they hold their child then take the blanket home with them when they are discharged. I would like to invite anyone if interested to stop in some Saturday morning and either join in the fun of making projects or just sit and visit for a spell.

Yarns of Love began in the spring of 2010. Since our beginning we have made and have had blessed over 2,000 articles. That's 2,000 lives that have been touched in one way or another by love and prayers. We even have a member that has taken it upon herself to make lap robes for a cancer center outside the state, sending our love to others well beyond our community and region. Please keep our group in your prayers that we can continue to work our hands to produce these items that bring comfort and prayers to those that receive them.

Linda has been with us 5 years and is the lead teacher in our transition into kindergarten preschool class. Her shoes are also going to be hard to fill, as she really worked hard to prepare our preschool children to enter kindergarten and succeed in our school system. Linda will be returning to Head Start as they are preparing to open a new location in Ashtabula. I wish her the best of luck on this new phase in her life.

Finally, let me relate a short story to all of you. New Leaf Childcare is a MISSION of New Leaf UMC. Over the past few weeks I have sat in church on Sunday and heard Pastor Scott remind us that 90% of Conneaut does not attend church any where. Keep this in mind as I continue. Currently there are over 100 children enrolled at the center. There are 76 families. Of those 76 families, I know for sure of only 15 that attend church any where. I then asked them, "When was the last time you stopped in between 3:00 & 5:00 to say Hi to some of these families as they pick up their children to go home?" I know, I know, not everyone can stop what they are doing and stop in to say hi to the center's families, but there is a great opportunity for everyone to reach out and "rub elbows" so to speak with not only families from the center but also from the Conneaut community. When is this you ask??? December 21st from 9:00 am - 11:00 am is the center's annual Breakfast With Santa here at New Leaf. Cost of the breakfast is by free will donation only and I invite each of you to come out for pancakes & sausage and spend time getting to know families from the center and the community. Plus, we will be having a Chinese auction for those last minute Christmas gifts. If anybody would like to donate an item for the auction you can drop that off to the center office. If you are a member of one of New Leaf's small groups, I am looking forward to seeing your group's donation this year.
